Extended Track Policy

- A. Extended students will take two years to complete one academic year of study. The student will retake the course(s) not passed.
- B. Once the student is extended, the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs will determine which courses are to be taken during the first extended year.
 - a. Courses to be taken during the extended, reduced coursework period will be done in consultation with the applicable course coordinator, student faculty advisor, and director of student services. It is imperative that the student has the resources and support necessary to succeed while on the extended track.
- C. During the year of extension the student must successfully complete all courses in which the student earned a grade of "F" or "NP or NC" in addition to any other courses not completed.
 - a. When a student retakes a course, the course is entered twice in the permanent record of the student. The grade earned each time in the course is recorded, but only the most recent grade is used in the computation of the student's cumulative grade point average.
- D. Students may undergo an extended year of study only once.
- E. Students on extended track will pay tuition based on credit hours (11 credit hours or less; 12 or more credits will be full time tuition) and are responsible for appropriate tuition.
- F. Scheduling of experiential rotations for students on an extended track may be limited.
